# Audition 2007

Thirteen students from last year's programme are successfully continuing with The Pettman Junior Academy of Music this year, seven students are continuing their studies full-time at The University of Canterbury and three students have moved overseas to study music abroad.

For the 12 available places in the Academy there was a huge response with 28 applicants auditioning on Saturday 4 November 2006 for the 2007 programme. From these applicants we chose 12 new students for the Academy.

# Baroque Masterclass

# Saturday 3 and Sunday 4 March, School of Music, Room 205, University of Canterbury

Douglas Mews, Wellington City organist, graduated from Auckland University in 1979 with a master's degree in organ and harpsichord, having studied with the late Anthony Jennings. He then continued his harpsichord studies with Bob van Asperen at the Royal Conservatory in The Hague in the Netherlands, and later expanded his interest in historical keyboards to include the fortepiano, taking lessons from Jacques Ogg and Bart van Oort.

As well as taking part in Wellington's busy concert life, he broadcasts for Concert FM and tours for Chamber Music New Zealand. With Penelope Evison (classical flute) and Euan Murdoch (classical cello) he has recorded the Haydn Trios with Flute for the Concordance label. As a church musician, Douglas has been choir director at St Patrick's Cathedral in Auckland, the English-speaking International Roman Catholic Church in The Hague, St Mary's Church in Nelson, and at St Teresa's in Karori.

Keyboard specialist at the NZSM, Douglas Mews teaches organ, harpsichord and fortepiano, as well as keyboard harmony. He also accompanies many of the performance students in lessons, workshops and recitals.



Korean recorder player **Eun Cho Yeom**, at only 15 years of age, is one of the most promising talents on her instrument. She has received several national prizes and she also won the Jury Prize in the 20th Early Music Competition YAMANASHI in 2006 in Tokyo. After moving to New Zealand in 2006 she received a prominent place at The Pettman Junior Academy of Music.



# Masterclass I

Australian String Quartet Friday 23 March 2007, 5pm – 8pm University of Canterbury, School of Music, Room 205 and 206

The end of 2006 marked the beginning of the Tankstream Quartet's new role as the Australian String Quartet (ASQ).

The Quartet, which has worked with Alice Waten at the Australian Institute of Music, is the only Australian group to have been participants in the prestigious chamber music class of the Alban Berg Quartet at the Cologne Hochschule für Musik.

In its six-year history, the Quartet also holds the distinction of having won more international chamber music competitions than any other ensemble in Australian history, including first prize at the 2005 Cremona International String Quartet Competition, the Gold Medal in the



2002 Osaka International Chamber Music Competition (Japan), first place in the 2001 Australian Chamber Music Competition, and second prize in the Paolo Borciani International String Quartet Competition in Italy in 2005.

Korean recorder player Eun Cho Yeom performed as a soloist at the Musiktage Merzig Festival in Germany in April 2007, which was organised by Wolfgang Kraemer, Director of the Pettman Junior Academy. They were involved and participated in masterclasses and concerts and thoroughly enjoyed this enriching experience of music making.
