Generous gift hits the right note

Young musical talent will continue to be nourished at the University of Canterbury thanks to a half million dollar donation from UK-based philanthropist Professor Barrie Pettman.

Professor Pettman and his wife, Maureen, have agreed to continue supporting the Pettman Junior Academy based at UC's School of Music with a donation of \$100,000 a year for a further five years. The money, gifted through the University of Canterbury Foundation, will be used to provide scholarships and cover the cost of running the academy.

The academy, established in 2006 thanks to an earlier donation by the Pettmans, offers tuition to talented young musicians plus frequent performance opportunities, chamber music

lessons, masterclasses and lectures. More than 40 students ranging in age from 7 to 17 attend the academy.

The Pettmans were guests of honour at a 90-minute concert last week featuring performances from 14 of the academy's young stars. Included in the concert was an impromptu singing of Happy Birthday for Professor Pettman who had celebrated his 65th birthday the previous day. A highlight of the concert was a solo performance by seven-year-old cellist Joo Kim.

Speaking after the concert, Vice-Chancellor Dr Rod Carr acknowledged the generosity and philanthropy of Professor Pettman. "Philanthropy is a rare commodity in today's world where we are all pressed for time and money. But let us not forget that the wealth of a nation is a lot more than what we have in

our bank accounts. The wealth of a nation is undeniably the skills and capabilities that we as an older generation enable our younger generations to acquire. It is our biggest gift as adults to children to empower and enable them with opportunities. It is philanthropy which is often necessary to oil that wheel in a modern society."

Dr Carr thanked Professor Pettman for his part in "helping give the gifts of knowledge and learning to the next generation of musicians". Professor Pettman said he was proud to have witnessed over the last three years the development of the academy and the enthusiasm and the dedication of the students and their parents. He said it was pleasing to see that academy students had won the title of the country's top student chamber music ensemble for the last two years.
